The U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing will provide a "Billion Dollar Display" of high-denomination money and demonstrations of its one-ton, hand-operated, Civil War-era money-printing press.

the show's visitors. Show hours are 9 AM to 5:30 PM daily. Admission is free for ANA members and \$6 for non-members. Children aged 12 and under are admitted free.
