



Operation Kindness Begins Tele-adoption Process for Animals in Need of a Loving Home, April 30

Families May Adopt Dogs and Cats With New Online Program

WHO: [Operation Kindness](#)—the leading no-kill animal shelter in North Texas.

WHAT: As a way to facilitate and continue its mission to provide homeless animals an opportunity to find a loving home, Operation Kindness is launching its tele-adoption services through its foster program. Available pets for adoption are currently in foster homes, but they need a permanent home and a family to call their own! The leading no-kill animal shelter is providing online appointments for adopters to discuss their interest in available dogs and cats with an adoption counselor. Adoption appointments begin Thursday, April 30.

DETAILS: From the comfort of their home, adopters may search Operation Kindness's online database for dogs and cats that are up for adoption. The database will be viewable online and in real time, although pets are not guaranteed to be available as adoptions are on a first-come, first-serve basis. Once a potential adopter decides which pet they are interested in, individuals may fill out a questionnaire and schedule an adoption phone call with an Operation Kindness counselor. Appointments will review important information about the animal, and if the decision is made to move forward with the adoption process, adopters will be able to arrange a time to pick up their new pet from Operation Kindness.

WHEN: Online adoption counseling appointments will be offered by Operation Kindness everyday beginning Thursday, April 30 — just in time for National Adopt a Shelter Pet Day!
